Sharpening Your Garden Tools Easily!

Before you sharpen any tools, you will need a pair of gloves to protect your hands, and a pair of safety glasses to protect your eyes.

I will show you how to sharpen garden pruners and garden loppers.

Please bring one pruner or lopper to the meeting to sharpen.

Since the workshop will take place at the February 7 meeting, you will have time to purchase either the flat files or the Corona tool and bring them with you so that you can sharpen your pruner or lopper after my demonstration.

I use the DMT Mini-Sharp with Fishhook Groove in coarse-grit (blue) and fine-grit (red) flat files because these are pocket sized which make them easy to use on the smaller blades of pruners and loppers.
